

Roberto Testi, M.D., is Full Professor of Immunology at the School of Medicine, University of Rome "Tor Vergata". He trained at the Department of Experimental Medicine, University of Rome "La Sapienza" (1983-1986), Dana Farber Cancer Institute, Harvard University, Boston MA, USA (1986-1987), then at the Monoclonal Center, Becton Dickinson, Mountain View CA, USA (1987-1990). He also was appointed Research Assistant at the University of California San Francisco, San Francisco CA, USA (1988-1990). In 1994 he started the Laboratory of Signal Trasduction (<http://www.labst.org>) at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata", committed to the discovery of mechanisms controlling programmed cell death. More recently he focused on Friedreich's Ataxia, a genetic disease associated with accelerated cell death. From 1994 to 2007 the research group led by Prof. Testi has been funded by five European Commission framework programs and by AIRC. In recent years substantial funding has been attracted from Telethon Italia, AtaxiaUK (UK), Friedreich's Ataxia Research Alliance (USA), National Ataxia Foundation (USA) and Association Française de l'Ataxie de Friedreich (France). Prof. Testi has served as biotechnology consulting expert for SKGF Attorneys at law, Washington DC, USA (2006-2008) and is the founder and chairman of BiotechValue (<http://www.biotechvalue.com>).
